<u>THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – 1 John chap. 3 verses 18 and 23</u>Let us not love with words or tongue, but with actions and in truth......and this is His command: to believe in the name of His Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us.

REFLECTION:

The identifying attribute of the Christian is the way he or she conducts themselves. We have recently been thinking of how we can tell our Christian story, in an effort to witness to others what God means to us and has done in our lives. This has been a hoped for result of the studies under "Everyone an Evangelist". It is about our effort in a small way to make more disciples of Jesus.

On 19th December, five of us told our personal faith stories to folk in the Coffee Shop. As believers we all have a story to tell. The problem, I think, is how to broach the subject to our friends, colleagues or neighbours.

As we read above, words come cheap, and the better witness is the kind of life we lead, the example we try to set in our language, attitudes and conduct.

How often have we met the critical question of censure "Call yourself a Christian?!"

It comes back to Jesus' exhortation to do to and for others what you can. To quote his words, "When you gave food to the hungry, and drink to the thirsty, when you welcomed a stranger and looked after one who was sick, or visited someone in prison, all of this you did for me: and when you did not do these things you did not do it for me." (Matt.25 paraphrased)

Now Jesus was truly human as well as being divine. As a human he experienced all kinds of situations that face each of us, including mockery, rejection, having no permanent home, friends who let him down and betrayed him, ultimately facing death in a horrific way. That is why he is such a wonderful life example, because he not only dealt with the difficult things in his life, but he went about performing deeds of kindness and love, and showed his divinity by performing miracles such as water into wine, raising Lazarus and feeding multitudes.

If we "believe in his name, and love one another, not just with words but with actions", we cannot but invite the question, "What motivates you, why do you do what you do?" thus opening the door to that conversation which leads us to telling our story of what God has done for us: because ultimately, we believe that what God has done for us, He can and wants to do for <u>anyone</u>. We may not talk someone into the kingdom, but we can with God's help love them in. Every blessing, *John*.
