REFLECTION – This weekend we celebrate 40 years of God’s blessings on our fellowship, recalling with gratitude all that God has done through us in the Methodist Church in the centre of Bromsgrove, and the surrounding community.

We also remember with fond memory those of our church family who are no longer with us, but whose friendship, advice, help and dedicated service contributed to our success in our many ventures of faith – we all have our particular memories, without mentioning names.

To recall some of the achievements of our fellowship.

Firstly was the important feat of integrating three congregations into one, when the members of New Road, Birmingham Road, and Carlisle Road came together as one new fellowship in this building, the construction of which, in itself, was a wonderful step out on a new faith journey in 1983. (We were not here then, only joining in autumn 1984).

Over the years we have enjoyed many different uplifting events including the Stewardship Campaign from which came several new initiatives. We had Wesley Guild for many years, now replaced by the new open-to-all friendship group Wednesday Meeting Point. We had a choir, then Centre Beat, we have still a flourishing Boys’ Brigade, along with the newer Girls’ Brigade. Further service to the community is offered by the Toddlers’ Group, Crosslinks Befriending, and the Knit and Natter group. We have had daily morning prayers; a monthly lunchtime service; at one time four house-groups, enabling members to share and learn.

A major feature of our outreach has always been the Coffee shop, and great thanks are due to those who have staffed it so cheerfully down the years.

In more recent years we have held many enjoyable social and fundraising events, and church fayres. I ‘m sure in this resume, I will have forgotten something. Forgive me.

As we contemplate how we have been blessed for the past 40 years, we realise that several of us have unavoidably aged while being involved in this faith journey, as a result of which we are now struggling to find the personnel we need to continue in God's mission field in this place. We have to come to terms with change in some ways.

We have had several Vision Day meetings recently to help us discern God's will for us and his work as we continue to be the Bromsgrove Methodist Church.

In Isaiah's words as the prophet of God to the exiled tribe of Judah, God is making promises to restore their fortunes and their homeland. He says "forget the former things, do not dwell in the past. See I am doing a new thing."

We need perhaps as we look ahead, to perceive what new thing/s God has in store for us,

and prayerfully try to dedicate ourselves to his service. If we look forward, that is an antidote to "living in the past" and helps us embrace whatever change is necessary to ensure our witness and service in this place continues, perhaps for another 40 years! Every blessing, *John*.
