THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK: Psalm 63 verses 6 & 7

"…. I think of you on my bed and meditate on you in the watches of the night, for you have been my help." <u>COMMENT:</u>

Some of us do not sleep very well and there are various things one can do to remedy that. Some read, some get up and make a hot drink, one person I know used to get up at 4am and delve into Ancestry.com ! Whatever helps to obtain the rest one needs, I guess.

Now David, who wrote this psalm when he was in the wilderness, thanks God for all of his loving care. In verse 3 for example he says "Your steadfast love is better than life".

With all of the conflict he faced and enemies on all sides at times, he doubtless suffered from insomnia. He called it the watches of the night, and it was the time when he wrestled with his problems.

We can relate to that, because when we have problems, they lay on our sub-conscious, and in the darkness of the night they magnify. Isn't it so that when we have had a bad night, with the coming of the dawn, and when we get up, it often seems less bad.

David found a huge help in meditating on God and his dealings with David to date while he lay on his bed, with sleep evading him.

So, what worked for David, and caused him to acknowledge God's help, may well work for us. Instead of uselessly counting sheep, let us instead count our blessings, and find that inner peace and restorative rest we all need. For when we review things, God HAS indeed been our help, and will continue to be so.
