THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – John 14 verses 16 to 17

<u>The words of Jesus –</u> "... I will ask the Father, and he will give you another <u>Coun</u>sellor to be with you for ever –The Spirit of truth......You know him for he lives with you and will be in you."

This Sunday we celebrate the gift of the Holy spirit to the new fledgling Christian community. It is said to be the Birth Day of the Church, when God's power was poured out on the assembled believers as promised by Jesus in the above text. The full exciting story is in Acts chapter 2.

What happened that day was to change the known world forever, as the Gospel (good news) of salvation through faith in Jesus' life, death and resurrection spread throughout the then Roman Empire, transforming lives and society for the better. For twenty centuries the Church has flourished as a power for good, giving hope for despair, light instead of darkness, life in abundance, all in response to God's call for universal love.

Jesus called the Holy Spirit the Advocate, the Counsellor, the Spirit of Truth and the Comforter. Christians today believe that the Holy spirit is still with us living and working in and through ordinary men and women, often unseen and unheard: just as Jesus promised that the Spirit would be with us for ever, enabling us to define truth from falsehood, and we know the Spirit as the third Person of the Trinity.

To have the power of the Holy spirit we have but to believe the words of Jesus and to pray that the living Christ will be with us and in us, empowering us daily to do whatever he calls us to do for him and the Kingdom of God. To his praise and glory. Every blessing, *John*.
