# THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Breath on me Breath of God by Edwin Hatch (19356-1889)

### **Extract from the Hymn:-**

- 1 "Breath on me Breath of God, fill me with life anew
- 2...until my heart is pure....3.till I am wholly thine....
- 4 So shall I never die, but live with thee to perfect life of thine eternity.

<u>Biography</u> – Edwin Hatch was a vicar in the Church of England and a professor of Classics at the University of Trinity College in Canada. He wrote "Breath on me" in 1876and published it privately. It was published publicly in 1886. When the United Methodist church later published it, it was described in these words – 'the simplicity of this profound hymn belies the education of its author'. Its sentiments refer to the creation of humanity by God in Genesis and to the spiritual breath which came to humanity via Jesus at Pentecost.

<u>COMMENTS:</u> The hymn is a plea for the Holy Spirit (the Breath of God) to fill the believer with new life, to purify the heart, and to make the recipient of God's

grace wholly God's. It is the work of the Spirit within us to transform us, to make us "God-centred" in worship and service instead of self-centred. The reward, we believe of such faith and of the Holy Spirit's ministry is a promise that we bever die, but live on beyond this physical realm in God's eternity. (See StF No. 370) In the second part of the first three verses we see he outcome of each plea being enacted in changed lives —

- V.1. Loving and doing what God Does
- V.2. submitting to God's will with spiritual endurance
- V.3. being "on fire" with spiritual zeal ("aglow with thy fire divine")
