### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Ecclesiastes 7 verse 14 (NIV)

"When times are good, be happy; but when times are bad consider: God has made the one as well as the other, so that a person cannot discover anything about their future.

#### **REFLECTION:**

Life is made up of good times and bad; joyful times and sad times. Life has to be a journey of faith, I think.

We don't have a crystal ball to tell us about our personal future: that is why astrology, tarot cards, clairvoyance are not for the Christian. We live by faith, one day at a time, and we hope that all of our tomorrows will be reasonably enjoyable, fulfilling and purposeful.

It is a coping mechanism that when times are not so good and problems beset us — as they inevitably will — we can find joy in the good things, the uplifting things that have been our good fortune to receive, and the recall of them gives us strength in the difficult times.

God helps us by his love and care to know he is in control of bad times as well as good.

God is the anchor in our lives who helps us to steer clear of the rocks of adversity which might otherwise sink us. We are reminded of that in the Boys' Brigade anthem - "We have an anchor that keeps the soul steadfast and sure while the billows roll".

So let us not want to know what the future holds for us as individuals, but to (to quote another hymn-song) "trust and obey, for there is no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey"
