THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK: Romans 12 verse 15

"Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn" REFLECTION:

Last week we looked at caring and sharing with those in need and how we as a church community practise hospitality.

Continuing with Paul's advice on Christian love, we are reminded that as a caring and sharing church family and fellowship we really feel for one another. We all experience good times and bad, that is the make up of life's rich tapestry. Risking repeating myself – we are not exempt suffering, pressures, stress, anxiety or grief. That is the flipside of the coin which offers us happiness, hope, joy, fulfilment, contentment.

The wonderful thing is that God is with us in all of life, with its ups and downs, its joys and sorrows.

So when we hear of someone's good news (rejoicing), we can be happy for them, pleased that they are experiencing, for example, a new relationship, success, birth of a child or grandchild, celebrating a significant anniversary, or milestone birthday, new home or new job, obtaining that strived for degree, or achieving sporting success: we can be grateful with them to God for his grace in that situation.

Equally, but harder to see for the individual who is suffering (mourning),God, through his Spirit, the Comforter, is offering uplifting, strength, courage, consolation. We don't only mourn for the passing of a loved one. Loss can come in varied forms – redundancy, breakdown of relationship, loss of one's home when having to cease to live independently, loss of mobility, or one or more of our faculties. Then it is that the individual needs understanding, compassion and a listening ear, to know that someone is there for them.

I think Paul is saying – that we have to be the conduit through which with God's help we relate to others in everyday life. May WE be able to show love by caring and sharing with each other, rejoicing and mourning as appropriate - a united fellowship, all in Christ's name. Every blessing, *John*.
