<u>THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - Philippians chap. 4 verse 5b and 6</u> The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer

and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

<u>REFLECTION</u> - This passage is part of the final exhortations (urgent instructions) from Paul to his friends at the church of Philippi. The passage from verse 4 to 9 covers the attitude believers should have towards their faith, and living it; and even includes the kind of things we should think about which are most beneficial to us. He speaks of rejoicing; being known for gentleness, and the special peace which our trust in God gives us. He concludes in verses 8 and 9 with urging Christians to think about (ponder, or dwell on) what is noble, right, pure, lovely and admirable.

Above, however we are reminded that we don't walk the path of faith alone. "The Lord is near". God is concerned about us and knows each of us intimately, he knows our needs before we ask, he knows our current situation and all of our personal circumstances. Therefore we don't need to "be anxious about anything". We can cast all our care on God. Did not Jesus say "Come unto me all you who are heavy laden, and I will give you rest, rest unto your souls"? If we doubt that God in Christ is near, we have but to remember Jesus' words where he says "Behold, I stand at the door and knock, and if you open the door (of your heart) and invite me in I will come and abide with you." What a wonderful promise.

We know God knows us and loves each one, and wants what is best for us; so our part is to come to our caring Lord, and bring "everything in prayer and petition to the One who loves us.

In our praying let us remember to recount all of the blessings we receive daily, and pray "with thanksgiving", taking nothing for granted. Every blessing, *John*.
