Volunteers are ideally good listeners, able to offer a few minutes a week or fortnightly to offer friendship and a connection to the outside world for people who are often housebound or isolated. Referrals come from various agencies in Worcestershire.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK Psalm 42 verses 1 & 2

"As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God."

COMMENT:

We are made in God's image the scripture tells us (Genesis 1), and we are also told that sin mars that image. But God in his goodness makes us right with himself through the cross of Christ. When we are spiritually re-born through faith and the work of the Holy Spirit, we yearn or long for God, regularly. His influence in our life becomes our driving force, our motivation.
