THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - StF No. 100 (part)

"Each little flower that opens, each little bird that sings..... the purple heathered mountain, the river running by, the sunlight that brightens up the sky....the pleasant summer sun, the ripe fruits in the garden, he made them every one.....all things wise and wonderful, the Lord God made them all." <u>COMMENT:</u>

It seems that summer is here at last! With it comes the season for picnics, barbecues, visits to the seaside, or, living as we do inland, visits to the lakes, rivers and canals we have within easy reach.

All such things we tend to take for granted. We even moan at birdsong and bright sunlight at 5 am, disturbing our precious sleep! However, we have just passed (21st) Summer Solstice, the longest day, and now days will be decreasing in length by a few minutes daily. By the way, 1st June was the beginning of meteorological summer.

All of this takes us to the wonderful words above, written by Frances Cecil Alexander in the 19th Century, where she attributes all of the natural world to God the creator.

Whenever we are in the countryside in summer, we are awe-struck by the wonder and beauty of all that God has made, inspiring us to think again about the harm that we can, and do, cause, to our beautiful planet earth.

The hymn "All things bright and Beautiful" mentions flowers, birdsong, purple heather, the rivers that burble as they gently flow, and reflect the sunlight, the pleasant summer sun, ripe fruits which we mostly buy in the supermarket or on a market stall, but what joy people have in growing their own!

We are reminded in the chorus that "all things wise and wonderful – the Lord God made them all". And in Genesis and in Psalm 8, we find our relationship to God's creation – we have been put in charge of it, a sacred responsibility, to care for what God creates, and to pass on our environment in a good condition to future generations. As we enjoy summer, in lovely surroundings, let us be thankful to God for his unfailing providence. Every blessing, *John.*
